Today, we continue our Thomistic study of the Hail Mary.

Having shown why men reverence angels, St. Thomas next teaches why angels reverence Mary as evidenced by Sacred Scripture in the three articles of the Angelic greeting. We begin with the first of these,

“full of grace”

Mary is more dignified than any angel. Dignity refers to moral excellence based on the divine standard; the more a man is dignified, the more he is godlike. Mary excels the angels in dignity on account of her fullness of grace. The angel Gabriel acknowledges this fact when he greets her, “Hail, full of grace,…” as if to say, “Hail, to one to whom I must bow to as thou surpass me in grace.”

The three ways grace fills the Blessed Virgin Mary

In her soul. Mary’s fullness of grace equipped her to perfectly fulfill the two operations for which grace is given: to do good and to avoid evil. This grace obtained Mary’s complete freedom from sin, both original sin (which St. Thomas wrongly thought Mary was cleansed from while in the womb of her mother like St. John the Baptist) and all actual sin, (mortal and venial): “Thou art all fair, O my love; and there is no spot in thee.” (Cant. 4:7)

In her body. Mary’s supernatural grace overflowed from her soul into her flesh. It is one thing when grace fills a soul to make it holy; it is a greater wonder should this grace spill out into the body. As when, on the Eve of Pentecost, St. Philip Neri received such a grace of charity that his heart grew physically, splitting his ribs, as diagnosed medically. More awesome, the overflow of Mary’s grace caused her body to become a place for conceiving the all holy Son of God. Hugh of St. Victor writes: “The Holy Spirit so kindled the fire of divine love in her (Mary’s) heart that it worked wonders in her flesh, yea, even so that she gave birth to God made man.”

Into all mankind. Mary’s fullness of grace overflowed from her soul into her body, and from thence overflows onto all mankind. It is indeed wonderful that a few saints, by means of grace, advance the salvation of many sinners; how more wondrous that a singular grace be given to one individual in particular who advances the salvation of all. So it is with Christ and Blessed Mary, “In me is all hope of life and of virtue.” (Ecclus. 24:25)

Mary is full of grace in all its plentitude; *ergo dixit Mariae*, “The Lord shall fill thy soul with brightness” (Is 58:11) for Mary, like the sun and moon, enlightens all poor sinners to see the true Light.
