Today's Introit takes from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians, ch. 4, vs. 4-6 & Psalm 84:2. We review them scripturally then understand them in relation to the feast.

The Epistle to the Philippians addresses the citizens of Philippi, a city north of the Aegean Sea, named after Philip of Macedon, father of Alexander the Great (360 BC). In 51 AD, during his second apostolic journey, St. Paul established the first Christian church here. Later, while in prison at Rome (61-63 AD), St. Paul wrote to the Philippians to witness thanks to God, *the Father of all consolation*, and to exhort the Philippians towards charity, unity, and humility; he also warns them against false teachers whom he calls dogs and *enemies of the cross of Christ*.

Chapter 4 is summed: "He exhorts them to perseverance in all good; and acknowledges their charitable contributions to him."

- 4. Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice.
- 5. Let your modesty be known to all men. The Lord is nigh.
- 6. **Be nothing solicitous; but in every thing, by prayer** (and supplication, with thanksgiving,) **let your petitions be made known to God.**

Rejoice in the Lord always. In another place we read: Always rejoice... In all things give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you all (1 Thes.5:16-18). Obviously, St. Paul got carried away... or did he? If we are God's and God is ours, if even now we have certain possession of our true joy, what is keeping us from rejoicing... perhaps, our hearts seek something besides God?

Psalm 84 is paraphrased: "The coming of Christ to bring peace and salvation to man."

2. Lord, thou hast blessed thy land: thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob.

The Feast of the 3rd Sunday of Advent continues our Christmas preparation with a special note on gladness. During this time of expectation (ticking off the days till Christmas) and penance (if only in an organ-less liturgy, flower-less altar, and oft sight of purple), the Church eases our burden by reminding us of the great joy to be had (when Christmas finally arrives) by allowing the liturgy to be dressed with organ, flowers, & rose (not pink, but rose) vestments. The Epistle stills our impatience: "The Lord is nigh. Be nothing solicitous..."; the Gospel stirs our vigilance: "...there has stood one in your midst,...". Rejoice in the Lord... Indeed, the Lord is nigh, He stands in our midst, in every tabernacle, at every Mass, in the faithful soul... why be solicitous? Rejoice in the Lord... The Lord blessed the land; He freed the captive from certain death... what is lacking? **Rejoice in the Lord always...** Again, "Rejoicing in the Lord" is an act of the will, informed by the intellect, which regards God's goodness and the moral certitude of one's salvation; it is not the rejoicing in the world as when one's football team wins, nor that derived from the fruit of the vine; no, this rejoicing regards peace of soul in the heart of man, not the piece of Aunt Chovy's pizza in the belly (no matter how tasty). Understanding this, we may clearly see that, in the Church of God, there is no room for a sad Christian; said again, the cry-room is for fussy babies, not sad Christians.
