

### Things to Know at Christ the King (CtK)

**Sunday Best:** Sunday is a day given especially to almighty God. In part, we show this by how we dress at the holy Sacrifice of the Mass on this day. When sitting, a woman's dress should reach below her knees, cover her shoulders, and rest near the pit of the throat; a man should wear a suit & tie, or, at least, a collared shirt & clean slacks.

**Baptism:** we ask that all families be active, registered parishioners 6 months prior to receiving this Sacrament.

**First Holy Communion & Confirmation:** your child's regular attendance at our catechism classes is anticipated of them before receiving these sacraments.

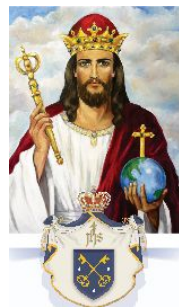
**Matrimony:** arrangements with the parish should be made at least 6 months in advance of a wedding date; participation in a priest conducted marriage preparation program is required.

**Regarding Confession,** as often time is limited to deal with situations in Confession, please know that the priests at CtK are available to meet with you outside confession times to help you with your spiritual dilemmas; simply call the office to arrange an appointment with either priest.

**If you are new to the parish,** it would please the pastor to meet with you; you may arrange an appointment through the secretary.

**Thinking of joining the Catholic Church?** Please contact the office; individual instruction will be arranged with our priests.

**A word on Sunday dress at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.** Thank you for abiding by the Sunday dress code at CtK (see above). For many who attend the TLM, the fittingness of the Sunday attire needs no explanation. Others may need a motive. It is a divine command to *honor thy father*. How does one honor another? By obedience. "He was obedient unto death" shows the extreme honor the Son gave the Father. Regarding our topic, we have an opportunity to imitate His example in a way far less painful yet very meritorious (as obedience is highly regarded in the sight of God). Again, some Catholics call their priest "father" as they recognize him as a spiritual guide. Other Catholics call him "father" as a mere title, more thinking of him as a vending machine, a means to get confession, communion, married, money, etc. For the Catholic who sees his priest as a "father" in the proper sense, and he wishes to please his father, please know he would like you to dress your best on Sunday (even now he assumes you are, but he needs, from time to time, to say these things in case he is wrong.) For the Catholic who sees his priest as a vending machine, these words won't do much, but today's Gospel might. What do we read? The Lord foretells the destruction of Jerusalem because its inhabitants do not know the time of their visitation then ejects some from the temple who were doing unbecoming things, saying "My house is the house of prayer." On the holy day of prayer, in the holy place of prayer, in offering holiest prayer on earth, what do you think we ought to wear? If Jesus visited CtK today, in his human form, would you be embarrassed?
