

## The Catechism of Fr. John Hardon: The 1st Commandment (continued)

**Dishonor to God and the First Commandment:** The First Commandment requires man to worship God through faith, prayer, adoration, and sacrifice. It can be violated not only by neglecting these duties but also by sins committed either through excess, by offering God improper worship, or through defect, by failing to give Him the reverence He deserves. The Church has long identified these sins as direct offenses against the virtue of religion.

**Superstition and Occult Practices:** Superstition consists in giving God false worship or placing undue confidence in religious practices as though they worked automatically. Closely related are occult practices such as divination, astrology, fortune-telling, spiritualism, and séances, all of which seek hidden knowledge apart from God. The Church condemns these practices because they substitute trust in creatures or secret powers for trust in divine providence.

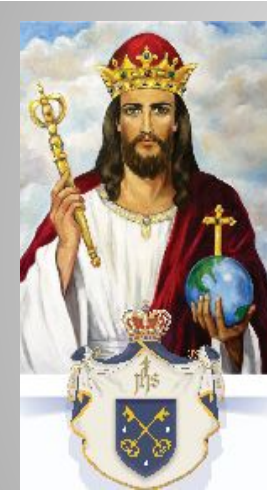
**Magic, Satanism, and Idolatry:** Magic, sorcery, and witchcraft claim access to powers beyond nature and often involve dependence on spiritual forces other than God. The most serious form is satanism, which deliberately invokes the devil and constitutes a grave rebellion against God. Idolatry likewise gives to creatures the honor owed to God alone. While ancient idolatry worshiped physical idols, modern idolatry often appears in the form of secularism, wealth, power, technology, or human self-sufficiency elevated above God.

**Tempting God and Sacrilege:** Tempting God means testing His power, wisdom, or mercy by demanding signs or presuming upon His protection. Sacrilege is the irreverent treatment of persons, places, or things dedicated to God. Its gravest form is irreverence toward the Holy Eucharist, especially receiving Holy Communion unworthily, since sacred realities belong to God in a special way.

**Simony and the Free Gift of Grace:** Simony, named after Simon Magus, is the buying or selling of spiritual things. From the earliest centuries, the Church condemned attempts to profit from God's gifts, whether through the sale of offices, sacraments, or spiritual privileges. Although legitimate fees and stipends may support the ministry of the Church, grace itself can never be bought or sold. Christ entrusted His spiritual treasures to the Church to be distributed freely for the salvation of souls.

**Conclusion:** All these sins share a common feature: they either attribute to creatures what belongs to God alone or fail to honor Him properly. Against them stands the virtue of religion, which directs man to worship the true God with faith, reverence, obedience, and love.

**Welcome to Fr. Andrew Daniels, FSSP**, one of four sons born to Sau and Lai Daniels, immigrants from Vietnam to the United States in 1991 who sought a life free from communism. He was born on November 9, 2000 in San Diego, California and lived there until he eventually joined the seminary in 2019. Growing up, he attended various public schools from K-12, and was active in school sports and clubs, such as playing in the football team for Kearny High School. Throughout his childhood and adolescence, Andrew was a member of the Vietnamese Eucharistic Youth Movement (VEYM), an international Vietnamese Youth Group having its origins in the Eucharistic Crusade initiated by Jesuit Father Albert Bessières. He began thinking of a vocation to the priesthood in his final years of high school. While inquiring with the Diocese of San Diego at the time, a member of VEYM introduced him to the Traditional Latin Mass. From there, he began frequenting the Fraternity’s apostolate, St. Anne Catholic Church in San Diego. It was there that he immersed himself in the parish life, nourished strong Catholic friendships, and learned how to serve the Mass. After graduating high school, Andrew attended a local community college, but after a year, he decided to visit and apply to the seminary for the Fall of 2019. He was ordained this last May and is here for his 1st assignment as a priest!
