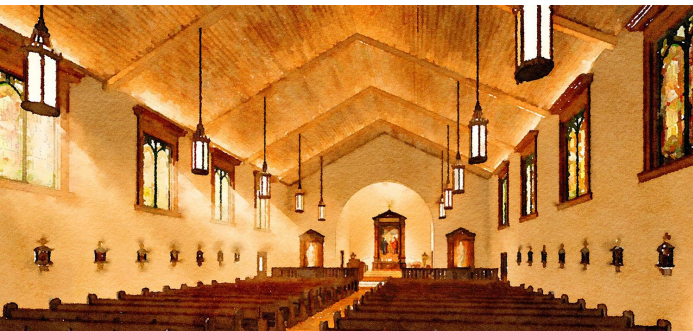


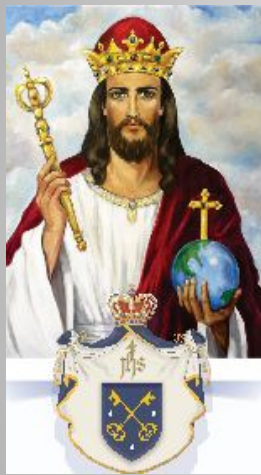
The Catechism of Fr. John Hardon: The 2nd Commandment

The Second Commandment—“You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain” (Ex. 20:7; Dt. 5:11)—does not merely forbid misuse of God's name but also prescribes its reverent use. Catholic tradition therefore associates this commandment with vows, oaths, and every form of speech that invokes the divine name. The commandment teaches that God's name is holy and must always be treated with reverence.

Vows: A vow is a deliberate promise made directly to God to perform some morally good act that is better than its omission. While vows existed throughout the Old Testament, Christ purified their meaning by insisting that they never excuse one from higher obligations of justice or charity. The New Testament also presents examples of vows, particularly in the life of St. Paul, while the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity, and obedience became the foundation of religious life. The Church distinguishes between public and private vows, solemn and simple vows, and personal and real vows. Anyone who has reached the use of reason is capable of making a valid vow, although ecclesiastical law regulates certain public vows, especially in religious life. Unlike an ordinary promise, a vow is made directly to God and therefore binds in conscience according to the seriousness of its object. Vows strengthen the virtue of religion by dedicating one's freedom to God and helping overcome human weakness through a stable commitment to spiritual good. Oaths: An oath is the reverent invocation of God's name as witness to the truth of what one says or promises. Properly taken, it is an act of divine worship rather than a violation of the Second Commandment. Christ's teaching in the Sermon on the Mount does not abolish lawful oaths but condemns frivolous, deceptive, and hypocritical swearing while calling Christians to such honesty that oaths become rarely necessary. A lawful oath must possess three qualities identified by the prophet Jeremiah: it must be truthful, just, and sincere. Truth excludes deliberate falsehood; justice requires a proportionately serious reason; sincerity demands an honest intention to fulfill what is promised. Perjury consists in deliberately making a false or insincere oath. This differs from merely imprudent or unnecessary swearing. The Church also recognizes adjuration—the solemn invocation of God's name or that of the saints to strengthen a lawful request or command—as seen both in Scripture and in the Church's liturgy. Exorcisms are a particular form of sacred adjuration directed against evil spirits.
